A Word from our Rector

It does not just seem that time is racing by. This year Lent will be the earliest it can be according to the formula that the church has used to determine these things over the centuries. Ash Wednesday is February 10! That may be the earliest I remember. Since Lent is meant to be a kind of spiritual retreat, a period of learning and reflection in preparation for the tumult of Holy Week and joy of Resurrection, I welcome it and invite you to join in!

Ash Wednesday will offer two opportunities to receive the Imposition of Ashes at St. Andrew's on February 10 - the 10:30am Contemplative Eucharist, and a 7pm Taizé service. In addition, Deacon Deirdre Moulinier and I will be offering "Ashes to Go" in uptown Sedona by the cowboy sculpture. Friday February 12 at 5:30pm will be the first of six weekly observances of Stations of the Cross at the church. You are invited to take part in this short interactive service and, if you wish, to sign up to lead it on one of the Fridays. Contact our Liturgist, Doug Sandvall, to make the arrangements.

My main purpose in writing to you is to ask you, no, beg you for my sake and yours to take part in a congregational reflection and study of WHO ARE WE NOW. It begins on the individual level with the Spiritual Gifts Inventory attached, (just below my article), to this Evangelist and also emailed to you in a separate email. Please print it out. Prayerfully engage with it. Fill it out and score it according to the instructions. Then, bring your results to the first of the Wednesday Soup and Study Evenings on Wednesday, February 17. We will be exploring what these results mean to us as individuals as well as a congregation. It is an amazing chance to know ourselves and one another more deeply. Even if you believe you know the congregation well, this will take you deeper.

To know ourselves as we are at this moment in our lives will allow us to build on that when the time comes to enter into a search for a new rector. It will identify not just our gifts but our learning edges. God has wonderful plans for St. Andrew's. We are called to do our part, to be ready and to stand on the ground of more than fifty years (58 and counting...). Here there is a Communion of Saints, a great Cloud of Witnesses. Let us honor what is past, stand on and in the present, and prepare a fertile ground for the future. ~ MLP+


If your score in the **Total** section is + Spiritual Gift listed next to the score.

A Word from our Senior Warden

Canon Megan Traquair has given the "green light" to the Vestry to begin the formation process of a Search Committee. Vestry members will be contacting parishioners right away to see who is willing to be a candidate to become part of the Search Committee. At the next Vestry Meeting, which is scheduled for Thursday, February 11, 2016, we will look at the names of parishioners who have expressed their interest. From this list, the Vestry will appoint the members that will form the new Search Committee.

Once the formation of the Search Committee is completed, there will be a joint meeting with the Search Committee, the Vestry and our Diocesan Search Consultant, Brian Belanger, to develop and complete a Parish Profile which will be posted to our website. The Search Committee will look at all of the Rector candidates to see if they meet the requirements espoused on the website and will forward this information to the Vestry. The Vestry will review information from the Search Committee about the candidates and will then choose the next Rector at St. Andrew's.



Health news

It is no accident that February is National Heart Month. With February 14th being St. Valentine's Day, we are reminded of all our relationships that add to our full hearts. But on a more health related note, National Heart Month is a reminder that we need to take care of our hearts. It is that important organ that pumps our life's blood throughout our bodies. We need to protect the heart so that it can do the job it was meant to do. Most of the time we take our hearts for granted as we move

through our busy lives. There are some simple things you can do to improve your heart health.

First, if you are overweight and you want to loose weight, pay attention to what you eat. Ask yourself, are my portion sizes too big? A protein portion of meat, fish or poultry should be the size of a deck of cards. Are you eating mostly fried foods? Try baking or boiling food instead. Do you eat at least three fresh vegetables and two fresh fruit servings each day or are you choosing high sugar desserts and snacks? The more overweight you are, the bigger the work load is on your heart. Even a small amount of weight loss can improve the functioning of your heart.

Another small way to improve your heart is to be sure to do at least 20 to 30 minutes of exercise on a daily basis. If you can exercise outside and enjoy our fresh air and surrounding beauty of nature, all the better. Exercise will not only provide more oxygen for your heart to send throughout your body, it will also help to make your heart stronger which can lower your blood pressure to a healthier level. A nice bonus of exercising is that it improves your mood, helps you to sleep better and can actually decrease your appetite a little bit. You don't have to train for the Olympics or pay to go to a gym. A simple walk each day can do wonders for your heart and mind.

Vestry Meeting Minutes from December 16, 2015

Members Present: Sr. Warden Jim Hose, Jeannette Sasmor, Irene Croft, Philip Valence, Monte MacConnell, Deacon Deirdre Moulinier, Margaret Kelley

Members Absent: Jr. Warden Jeanne Hawn, Barbara Livermont, Carolyn Stillman, Priest Mary Piotrowski, Terry Knox

Jim Hose led us in a beautiful prayer for transitions.

Vestry Minutes: The minutes for the November 2015 Vestry Meeting minutes were corrected by one word, "aid" in the Deacon's Report. The sentence to read, "Deirdre said that last Friday there was a Mental Health First Aid Day where 20 people attended." The minutes were approved as amended.

Treasurer's Report: Phil stated that the projected budget for the end of the year will hopefully have a \$21,900 surplus (more than we expected). The Operating Budget has 5% more in expenses than budgeted and 21% more income than expenses. It is good accounting to close out the year by spending all the money that we have in 2015 budget. The final total from the September 2015 Rummage Sale was \$8,600. A mid-2015 vote was to give \$4,000 from the Rummage Sale income to church operating expenses and the rest to the ECW for outreach plus a 50% differential if the church operating budget is ok. So, that gives the ECW outreach \$4,000 + \$2,300 = \$6,300. The Vestry will make the final distribution of money with the recommendations from the ECW. The Vestry suggested these recipients: Sedona Food Bank, Monday Night Suppers, NAU Canterbury House, Verde Valley Women's Sanctuary, Discretionary fund of Priest and Deacon.

Motion: It was moved, seconded and carried that we gratefully accept \$4,000 from the ECW for Church Operating Expenses and leave the balance for outreach.

Motion: It was moved, seconded and carried to transfer \$2,500 from the 2015 budget surplus to the Capital Improvement Fund.

Motion: It was moved, seconded and carried that any remainder of surplus money be forwarded to the General Fund of 2016.

Motion: It was moved, seconded and carried that Phil's Treasurer's Report be accepted.

Deacon's Report: Deirdre raised a question about creating and recognizing a Communications Committee. This committee creation was suggested in the Strategic Planning Meeting in August. Vestry needs to implement an active committee. Jeanne did talk to the Red Rock news Editor about getting St. Andrew's news in the non-religion page. It would be great to write an article on the religion page of the Red Rock News. We celebrated a World AIDS Day Service. It was the first in Sedona! Deirdre showed a Deacon's Handbook from Bishop Smith. Most statements in the handbook indicate that the Deacon reports to the congregation. Also, Deirdre has to have a new Letter of Agreement with every priest-in-charge at St. Andrew's. Fr. Charles Crane recently died at Sedona Winds. He was Deirdre's grand-mentor as her mentor Jean Grant, was the mentee of Fr. Crane. There is a Brunch, December 26th at St. Andrew's for those who are alone. It would be great to have help from the Vestry at 9:30 am.

Motion: It was moved, seconded and carried to approve for IRS purposes, a housing allowance for our rector at an annual rate of \$30,000.

Motion: It was moved, seconded and carried to approve a Deacon's Discretionary checking account, accompanied by a Debit Card.

Maintenance Report Action Items by Monte MacConnell: There was an important discussion of known deferred maintenance at St. Andrew's:

1. Paint the inside of Parish Hall
2. Fire Suppression System check and repair, \$500-\$1,000
3. Leaks in the plumbing - recently 3 times - water bills went from \$34.34 to over \$400; one leak at 1 gallon per minute - valves had to be replaced
4. Hanging bulb in the Sanctuary
5. Joe Cantrella is out of the hospital. We need to be supportive of him.
6. Exposed wiring on right side of the church for air conditioning. We can't control the on/off heat and air on right side. It's possible that the right controls the left and the left controls the right?
7. We need to ask for a free APS energy audit
8. We need to look into solar panels for the church; preferably creating shaded parking.

Sr. Warden Report:

1. Jim handed out a list of people's names that were gathered from parishioners who volunteered to serve on various ministries in the Parish, (they answered the purple survey in the 2016 Commitment Letter). The Vestry Liaison needs to contact each person listed on the "Time, Talent, Treasure" list and acknowledge and thank them for wanting to participate in the Community of Hope, Morning Prayer, etc. Then the Vestry liaison needs to forward those names to the "head" of each ministry. That head of ministry can get the parishioner involved in that ministry.
2. Jim handed out new Bi-laws and Canon
3. Nomination Committee for Vestry of 2016 is the outgoing vestry members.
4. Read a letter from the Bishop

Motion: It was moved, seconded and carried to adjourn the Vestry meeting.


