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A Word from our Interim Rector

It seems that on a weekly basis I am asked why individual members of St. Andrew's are not to remain in contact with your previous rector, Mary. I explain that the Diocese as well as the National Church has a policy that states that when a priest retires or relocates, the priest is not to continue contact with previous church members for at least one year after leaving. I have explained that this policy is for the benefit of the

church as well as for the benefit of the retiring/relocating priest. I have heard responses to this that are cast in negative language, i.e. "why are we shunning her? why is this forbidden?" It is not shunning and forbidden makes this policy seem so mean when that is certainly not the intention. The Rev. Mike Kinman, Dean at Christ Church Cathedral, St. Louis, Missouri, has written an excellent article about this policy upon his leaving to become rector at All Saints, Pasadena. He has given me permission to share his article with you. I will leave out the personal parts that are specific to his congregation. 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Taking Leave

Charlie Brown, that great 20th Century nihilist philosopher, speaks for so many of us here. I know he speaks for me.

I hate goodbyes.

The problem is goodbyes are inevitable. Whether we like it or not, someone always leaves.

Goodbyes are hard . . . We hate them. But it's important to do them well. In the church, we have a checkered history on goodbyes. Maybe it's our theology of our inter-connectedness as the Body of Christ ... or maybe it's because at our best we lay our whole lives on that Eucharistic table together that makes it so hard to let go of relationships that have meant so much to us.

But let go we must. So I want to talk about that a bit.

One of the things I have had to learn as a priest is the difference between being a priest and a friend.

Friends are wonderful, and I hope you have lots of them. I know I do, and they are fantastic!

Being someone's priest is different. As your priest, my primary job is to gather you with the rest of the community around the presence of Christ and lead us all in laying our lives on the table with Jesus. It is to preach the word of God in ways that lead you to do the same. It is to have relationships with you where my primary concern is always your discipleship of Jesus and how that is lived out in the church and in the world.

Like friendship, it involves a deep, deep love and affection. Like friendship it involves holy companionship. That's why the two are often confused.

But unlike friendship, while you might have many friends, you don't have tons of priests. Having someone as your priest is a unique and specific role ... much in the same way that I have many sibling priests but only one Bishop.

I had the conversation about this distinction . . . and someone at the table said:

"But when you say you aren't my friend, it feels like you're saying you don't love me."

My response was "I completely get that it sounds and feels that way ... but it's actually the opposite. The greatest joy of my priesthood is that I am called into a loving relationship with you that is incredibly deep. The difference is it is a relationship where I am called to

put your well being, your discipleship of Jesus and care of you and the community above any need or desire of my own. It means that I need to be willing to speak truths to you and hear truths from you that I might not be willing to from a friend because of fear of damaging or losing the friendship.

"The difference is also that, frankly, I'm probably not going to be friends with everyone in a congregation ... and if I'm friends with some and not with others, that can send the message that Jesus loves some of you more than others ... and what a perversion of the Gospel that would be!"

"Our relationship as congregant and priest is wonderful and difficult. It is a unique blessing. And the truth is, if I am going to be sure I am being your priest, I have to be clear that I am not your friend."

So what does this have to do with saying goodbye?

One of the most common things clergy hear (and, regrettably, say) as we leave congregations is "it's OK ... we can still be friends."

We can still talk. We can still hang out. I can still come to you.

It is that Charlie Brown piece of us talking. That piece that hates to say goodbye so much and that wishes so much we didn't have to ... and that even thinks it's stupid that we need to.

I feel it, too.

I hate this goodbye.

I think about not being here to sit at your bedside as some of you die and not being able to lay your ashes in the chapel. I think about not being able to baptize ... and it breaks my heart and fills my eyes with tears. But those tears are the cost of a calling that allows me the privilege of loving each you so deeply -- and of accepting your love in return.

So why that cost?

Because I have not been your friend ... I have been your priest . . . And you . . . will need someone else to fill that role. And if I am still there -- even if we call it "as a friend" -- it will be all the more difficult for someone else to come in and fill that role. And that will be bad for everyone. . .

I have been in congregations where this has been done poorly -- and it is bad all the way around. I have been in congregations where former clergy left the jobs but stayed connected to the community, and it made the job so much harder for I and other clergy who followed -- because there was no incentive for the people to do the hard work of building the new relationship with the new priest when the path of least resistance was to maintain the familiar relationship with the former priest. It's not impossible. But it is a lot harder.

At worst, this has included former clergy meddling and second guessing ... but even at best it has not been healthy or helpful .. particularly for the new clergy that arrive and are trying to take their place at the altar and in the midst of the community.

I don't want to do that to my successor and I don't want to do that for you.

If I were to try to maintain friendships after I left, frankly, it would be selfish. It would be me putting my own desire to stay connected to you over what is best for you and this congregation. And I'm not going to do that.

My deepest desire . . . is that you be a community of bold, joyful, healthy disciples of Jesus Christ. And the best thing I can do to help you continue on that road is truly to leave so that you can embrace and love your new 'rector' -- whomever she may be -- and to hold you in prayer for the rest of my life.

So that is what I will do. And that is what I ask you to do as well.

When I walk out the door . . . I will be holding you on my heart, and that will never change. But I will not be maintaining relationships. I will hold you in prayer always, but I will not be checking in to see how you're doing. . .

Does that mean you or I need to duck behind a shelf if we run into each other . . . ? No. We don't have to be rude to each other or make a big deal of scrupulously making sure our paths never cross or names are never spoken of again. . .

If your new 'rector' decides she wants to invite me back at some point and that is something I am able to do, then that could happen someday ... but that will be her call. In the meantime, I won't be reaching out to you and I ask that you not reach out to me. Not because I don't love you or because I think you don't love me ... but because of the opposite. Because while it has been the deepest honor to be your priest for these past seven years, I know the best way I can honor that is by getting out of the way so someone else can come in and experience the incredible gift of being your priest without me hanging around.

I take heart that Charlie Brown's yearning -- and my own -- never to say goodbye actually will be fulfilled. It is both present reality and sure and certain eschatological hope. St. Paul reminds us that:

Neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8:38-39)

Though we are parted, we are always connected. That is the joy of being the Body of Christ. And it is that joy and hope that lets me do what I need to do and lets you do what you need to do ... and that is to part well, pray continually for one another, and entrust one another and all our lives to Christ our Lord.

Our time together is ending.

The love of God in Jesus Christ is forever.

Thanks be to God."

A special thank you to the Rev. Mike Kinman for his permission to share this with you. I do know that the strong and loving congregation at St. Andrew's wants what is best for your former rector, Mary, as well as for the new rector you will invite to share your lives. However, I am delighted to report that all of the symptoms for which I had the back surgery are now gone! So, the surgery was a success! I look forward to returning to St. Andrew's and to seeing all of you very soon.

St. Andrew's 2016 Vestry Meeting Minutes of May 12, 2016

Vestry Minutes of April 14, 2016 were approved as amended (proof reading)

Vestry Minutes of March 19, 2016 needed correction: Winnie Follett, our Verger was commissioned as an International Verger, not a Diocesan Verger

New Business:

The Treasurer's Report: presented by Gary Livermont

There was a \$3,000 expenditure that was approved, however, it was "not expected", (when the budget was written in December 2015), as a gift to Priest Mary Piotrowski upon her retirement.

Additionally, up to \$2,000 was approved to "freshen up" the Rector's office. Please see handout for details.

The Rev. Kate Bradson, Vicar of St. Andrew's, Tucson, AZ requested a copy of our budget. Vestry agreed that Gary send our budget to her.

Deacon Deirdre has requested a telephone in her office. She has important work as the pastoral care contact person for our parish. The telephone tree in the office needs to have a selection for the Deacon's office. Gary did some research to find the provider that would be the least expensive phone carrier servicing Sedona. Suddenlink could save us hundreds of dollars per year. Linda Rachel will call our current carrier, Century Link, to find out if we have a binding contract with them. This will help to determine if we can change carriers. Please see Gary's handout for more detail.

Action Item: It was moved, seconded and carried that the Treasurer's Report be filed for audit.

Action item: It was moved, seconded and carried to remove Priest Mary's name from the checking and savings accounts and put Philip Valence as a signatory on the account.

Action item: It was moved, seconded and carried to remove Priest Mary's name as a signatory on the Rector's Discretionary Checking Account and put the Rev. Grayce Rowe's name on as a signatory.

The Finance Report: presented by Philip Valence, Chairman

Bids are being sought for a window washer. Phil received one bid so far, a once per year \$290 for all the windows in the church and parish hall from Window Works.

Monte MacConnell cautioned that the Rose Window over the altar has lost some caulking and there are several windows in the Sanctuary that are loose. A Glazer needs to be hired to fix the windows. Monte will follow up on this item.

Action item: it was moved, seconded and carried to authorize Monte to look into getting the windows fixed.

Rector's Report: by Grayce Rowe:

1) Can Deacon Deirder Moulinier come to Vestry Meetings to help maintain continuity for the clergy? A resounding "yes" was heard from every member of the Vestry. We would love to have her as often as her schedule permits. We would also appreciate a monthly Deacon's Report, (or reports for as many months as she can fit it into her schedule). She is always welcome!

2) Is the Vestry open to having meetings such as AA (Alcoholics Anonymous), NA, (Narcotics Anonymous), OA (Overeaters Anonymous)? Usually for these groups, the "user fee" is waived and a donation from the groups is accepted.

Discussion: We want no smoking by group members on campus, (including in the buildings). We don't want cigarette butts on campus. They would have to smoke on the other side of the parking lot. If a problem arises with the use of church property, then we would have to address it. Many churches in Sedona have these groups using their property. Perhaps we could mirror what they have negotiated with the groups.

3) During Sunday Services, be considerate of people who do not want to hold hands during the singing of the Lord's Prayer.

Action item: *It was moved, seconded and carried - Interim Rector's Housing Motion, "Whereas the Rev. Grayce O'Neill Rowe is employed as a minister of the Gospel by St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, Sedona, AZ, which does not provide residence for her. The Vestry reserves that of the total annualized compensation to be paid to the Rev. Rowe, that \$5,000 be designated as "housing allowance" within the meaning of that term as used in Section 107 of the IRS Code of 1986. The housing allowance exists as a tax benefit to clergy and the amount is always determined by the clergy person. This in no way increases her salary and in no way impacts the church's budget.*

Phil Valence presented the following concept: *To facilitate and enhance Vestry discussions, I would like to please include the following motion:*

Action item: *It was moved, seconded and carried that the Vestry of St. Andrew's Church adopt the following "Protocols for Vestry Meetings."*

1) *Not less than 7 days before each Vestry meeting, every Vestry Liaison shall submit a monthly activity report for their assigned committees to all Vestry members for review.*

A) *The agenda for each Vestry meeting shall list the reports submitted and available for questions under, "New Business" and "Other Reports".*

B) *Reports will not be read at meetings. The Vestry questions or comments, if any, may be clarified by email or other communication prior to the meeting. Meeting discussion should be limited to relevant issues.*

C) *Action items, if any, shall be noted for the record and the reports accepted for the record by the Vestry.*

2) *Not less than seven days before each Vestry meeting, motions to be proposed by the Vestry member that requires action by the Vestry, (e.g. for expenditures, program changes/additions, etc.), shall be submitted to all Vestry members for review.*

A) *the agenda for each meeting shall list all motions submitted under "New Business".*

B) *Motions should be supported by information describing the reason(s) for the motion and associated costs. The sponsoring Vestry member should be prepared to discuss issues relevant to the motion.*

C) *Motions shall be moved and seconded prior to being opened for discussion.*

D) *Following discussion, the Vestry shall act upon the motion and the action shall be noted for the record.*

Discussion regarding the above motion: *Some Vestry members do not come to the table with a background in business or law and do not have their concepts codified into a motion until they are able to discuss their issue fact-to-face with the other Vestry members. Some Vestry members may not be near a computer during the deadline time. There will be many legitimate reasons why some Vestry members will be unable to meet the Protocols. Members of the Vestry will try their best to be in compliance with the "Protocol Motion". As a result, some leeway will be advanced for Vestry members who are unable to comply. A possibility exists that future potential Vestry members may not run for Vestry if this provision is strictly enforced.*

Jim Hose brought up for discussion the concept of a "Snowbird Representative" on the Vestry. A discussion ensued. Vestry meetings are open to all parishioners. Further research is needed. Jim will contact Janet Wakefield about being the representative for the Snowbirds.

Jim Hose brought up the idea that the Vestry should all wear tags that read "Vestry". Vestry members should wear these tags on Sundays with their name tags. It was suggested that Jim ask Peter Bloomer to make 15 "Vestry" tags that match our name tags.

Discussions: "Time, Talent, Treasure List" and the "St. Andrew's 2016 Vestry Ministries/Liaison":

Irene Croft agreed to be the Vestry Liaison for the Church Membership Committee.

Irene Croft has written notes to visitors if Greeters are able to secure a legible address in the Visitor Sign-up book, (in the Narthex) for years.

More Greeters would be great. A suggestion was made to ask children to be Greeters.

The 2016 Parish Directory is in process with Shirley and Deirdre. Please give corrections to Shirley in the church office.

Correction to "Membership Committee" - Sally Kohrs is the Usher Coordinator.

Search Committee Report: presented by Jim Hose

1) The Parish Profile is being produced. Some parts are done.

2) Priest Megan told the Search Committee that the summer months are best for Priests to be looking for a new parish. So better to get written materials out soon.

3) Please pray for the Search Committee. Jim wants to put a prayer for the Search Committee in every Sunday bulletin so that the whole parish prays corporately for them every Sunday.
