*March already, and I am feeling a bit of kinship with the March Hare, (illustration by John Tenniel from Alice in Wonderland), who is stuck at tea time because he believes that the Mad Hatter has murdered time. Don't know about Hatters (and surely will not name one though we all know someone who wears a very odd hat...) but I do know the time is short for me and that the task for all of us is to Stay in the Present. There are many more important things we have to do together in the next month and a half.*

*I want to commend to you the continued observance of a Holy Lent. In addition to the chance to join with others in the congregation for soup and conversation on Wednesday evenings and Stations of the Cross on Fridays, a Lenten Quiet Day is being offered on Saturday March 5 by Verger, Winnie Follett. Looking forward to Holy Week, you are invited, in truth, urged, to walk with Christ and all of your St. Andrew's family the last week of Jesus' life, death, and glorious resurrection.*



*The schedule for Holy Week is as Follows. This is the NOW We Walk:*

**Palm Sunday / Sunday of the Passion**  
**8am and 10am March 20**

**Process with branches of palm. Rejoice at Jesus's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Participate with all your heart in the re-enactment of the brutal events of that week when all of us read the gospel account together.**

**Maundy Thursday Eucharist and Vigil at Gethsemane**

**7pm Eucharist followed by Vigil until 10pm March 24**

**Remember that Last Supper, the fellowship that culminates in an opportunity to wash another's feet and receive that same washing yourself - a poignant reminder of the humility both in giving and receiving that marks the life of faith. After sharing Eucharist, our last full meal together before the Resurrection Eucharist on Easter, we watch as the Altar Guild strips the sanctuary and the altar - empties our usual worship space - and the remaining consecrated sacrament is processed to a small altar, the Altar of Repose, at the back of the church, symbolic of Jesus's hours in Gethsemane leading up to his arrest, trial, and crucifixion. You are invited to stay for a while and keep vigil, then depart in peace.**

**Good Friday Liturgy and Vigil**

**12 Noon Friday, March 25**

**Come to observe the hour of Jesus's crucifixion. Receive a share of the Reserved Sacrament processed to the Altar of Repose the previous evening. Say ancient prayers and sit in Quiet prayer during the hours of the cross. Scripture sets the death of Jesus at 3pm. Thus, our Vigil will be kept until that hour. At the end of the Vigil, the candle that symbolizes the Light of the Presence is extinguished, not to be relit until the Resurrection.**

**Holy Saturday Quiet Work Day**

**9am Saturday, March 26**

**There is a long tradition of "Grief Work," preparing the house for a gathering, washing the Body, finding comfort in the busy-ness and quiet companionship... This is what our work day is about. Personal space, washing and polishing, periods of prayer and reflection, loving care of those things that relate to the one who has died for us. We gather to work quietly through the morning, then join in a monastic lunch of soup and bread - listening to readings as we eat before we go our separate ways.**

**Holy Saturday - The Great Vigil of Easter**

**7pm, March 26**

**In one of the most beautiful and memorable liturgies of the church, we come together in anticipation of the Resurrection. We will witness the lighting of the New Fire, share the stories of our heritage as People of God, and renew our Baptismal Covenant before our Easter Joy. Bring your bells to ring as we end this service!**

**The Day of the Resurrection Holy Eucharist**

**8am and 10am, March 27**

**Our Joy will ring out in Songs of Resurrection, shared prayers of thanksgiving and celebration at our Lord's victory over death. Share in the newly consecrated Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. There is no other day in the Christian year that has more significance for each of us as believers - and Children of the Resurrection. Come Let Us Adore Him!**

*The Sedona Literacy Center has had a year of change at West Sedona School. A new principal and a new reading specialist to coordinate with. We also have fewer volunteers, which always determines how many student we can accept into the tutoring program. So far, most of the students we have in the tutoring program are from one 2nd grade class.*

*At Big Park Community School we had in our program, an even mix of 2nd and 3rd graders and about twice as many volunteer tutors as were available in the West Sedona program.*
